In less developed countries, the replacement rate is around 2.3 because of higher childhood and adult death rates. World Fertility Rates Vary Widely Nonetheless, with total fertility rates of 6.01 in Mali and 6.49 in Niger (as of 2017), the resultant growth in these countries' populations is expected to be phenomenal over the next few years, unless growth rates and total fertility rates drop.

Fertility in Developing Countries

The decline in fertility by more than half in low-income countries in 40 years (1965–2005) is not yet comprehensively accounted for, although demographers are agreed that these trends in fertility are irreversible and the size of the world's population will stabilize later in the 21st century.

Why are birth rates dropping in developed countries?

Demographic transition occurred with a sharp reduction in fertility rate, occurred simultaneously in several countries in the 1870s. The decline in the infant and child mortality rates has been a dominant explanation for the declining fertility rate in many developed countries, with notable exception in France and the United States.
